The Mustard Seed

There's an old saying that goes "The road to hell is paved with good intentions." I don't know if I believe that or not, but I do know that sometimes we can indeed have the best of intentions . . . only for our efforts to fall flat.

One of those places of "good intentions" where our hearts might be in the right place, but the outcome of our efforts is less than helpful can be found in the things we say to people who show up to church after not having been there for a while. We mean well (or at least I hope we do), but it might be helpful to think for a moment about how those words sound to the other person. So, with a heart filled with love and appreciation for YOU – the regular worship attendee – I offer the following lists:

What You <u>SHOULD NOT</u> Say to People You Haven't Seen at Church in a While:

1. "Long time, no see" or "It's been a while"

Nothing like stating the obvious to make someone uncomfortable right out of the gate. They know it's been a while. You know it's been a while. If everyone knows it's been a while, no one needs to say it out loud. Depending on how you say it, it can even come across a little sarcastically, which achieves the opposite of what you're trying to accomplish.

2. "We've missed you" or "Where have you been?"

While this certainly comes from a place of love and is a sincere attempt to make someone feel included, it can also carry a sense of "you should've been here." Grace, not guilt, needs to be the emotion we convey to them. People have all sorts of reasons for not having come to church, some big and significant, some mundane and inconsequential. If someone feels like they are in a supportive and loving environment, they will eventually share their story with those they trust. Being put on the spot right away does not build trust and does not create a context of safe sharing.

3. "Hope to see you again next Sunday"

It's one Sunday. Let's not pile on the added pressure of expectations that they'll be here every week from here on out, serving on boards, and helping with events. Let them take it at their pace, with their ongoing circumstances to deal with.

What You <u>CAN</u> Say to People You Haven't See at Church in a While:

1. "Hello! It's good to see you!"

This is something you would say to anyone, whether you saw them last Sunday or last summer. It's a friendly conversation starter and helps someone feel welcome. Again, they are well aware how long it's been since they last were in church. A welcoming, friendly, non-judgmental, and innocuous greeting can go a long way to reducing the initial butterflies of returning to worship.

2. "How are you doing?" or "What's new?"

Similar to an open-ended greeting, this invites conversation in a non-contextual manner. That is, you're just talking about life events without the added factor of why those life events may or may not have kept them from church.

3. "How is [loved one] doing?" or "How is [situation] going?"

If someone hasn't been in worship in a while, a way to certainly make them feel welcome is to pick up where you left off regarding a loved one or a situation they have talked about in the past. For you to remember that and inquire again makes them feel valued, remembered, and cared for.


This list is not exhaustive, nor do I think you have to memorize it completely. It is not my intention to make you feel anxious or that you have to tip-toe around the subject of someone's absence from worship. It is often better to draw near and say the clumsy thing than it is to stay away and say nothing at all for fear of saying the wrong thing.

But don't let that be a reason for not loving with intention. We can be mindful of how we welcome someone. The key is to be gentle, warm, non-judgmental, and focus on their current presence instead of their past absence. And when in doubt, love like Jesus.
