Joint Board Meeting Recap

The Joint Board met on September 23rd, led by Pastor Bruce. This was not a Call Process meeting and we addressed a number of topics.

A large focus of the board meeting was a review of all of our events and fund raisers at Christian Faith in order to identify if there were some that we should not continue. We are aware that some members feel we have too many events.

After discussion, we decided to drop the Potato Bar for lack of participation and we learned that this year's mum plant sales will be our last that is offered by Cheryl and Jerry. As both of these benefit the Youth Ministry, we decided it was time to increase the cost of our pop and bottled water from 50 cents to \$1.00 each. It has been nearly impossible to purchase pop for less than 50 cents. The increase in profits from pop and water sales will more than make up for what was earned in the two dropped activities. It was also decided that we will always advertise where proceeds will go - whether to CFMC or if to missions. Another suggestion was to have Joyful Noise offerings quarterly starting in 2026.

Budget Committee and Nominating Committee board representatives and possible members at large were identified as preparation is beginning for the Fall Church Council meeting. We also noted that the Ministry sign ups did not have many names added as Fellowship Hosts, Scripture Readers and Call to Worship. It was suggested that we check if Kari is able to offer a link for people to both confirm that they wish to remain on the existing lists as well as offer an opportunity to drop off the schedules.
